

- Corrugated cardboard
- Aluminum cans
- Automobile batteries
- Used motor oil* (*uncontaminated—5 gallons max*)
- Used antifreeze (*uncontaminated—5 gallons max*)
- White goods (*old appliances-fee*)
- Scrap metal (*fee*)
- Passenger tires (*limit 10 per day—fee*)
- Glass bottles and jars (*All colors*)
- Household batteries (*includes rechargeable*)

- Mixed plastics; bleach containers, milk jugs, soda bottles, water bottles, etc. (*no lids, please rinse*)

Reduce Your Waste!

Recycling is great, but reducing waste in the first place is even better. Waste reduction saves disposal costs, protects our resources and saves landfill space at the landfill near Ephrata. Most of all, you can decrease how much you dispose of even with limited recycling opportunities in Grant County. The following are ideas on how to reduce your waste and make a difference:

- Choose items with the least amount of packaging or buy items in bulk quantities if you know you will use all of the product.
- Remove yourself from junk mail lists. Mail or fax the address label back to the company that sent the mail and ask to be removed from the mailing list. Don't fall for "free drawing" forms at stores or restaurants. They usually just want your address to send junk mail.
- Leave your grass clipping on your lawn instead of bagging them.
- Donate unwanted items to Goodwill or a local thrift shop. Have a yard sale or give to a friend or relative.

Cut back on the number of subscriptions to newspapers and magazines. Instead, share subscriptions among family or friends.

Accepts:

- **Commingled Recyclables:** Milk jugs, plastic bottles (necks must be smaller than base), paper milk-style cartons, phone books, shredded paper in paper sack, mail, magazines, mixed paper, catalogs, metal cans, aluminum cans, newspaper and inserts, paper bags, cereal boxes, paper or frozen food boxes

Does not accept the following: Glass, batteries, pill bottles, plastic bags, toxic product containers, plastic tubs, plastic lids and caps, frozen food bags, juice boxes, foil, food-contaminated paper plates and napkins, plastic cups, glassware, ceramics, light bulbs, metal hangers, chip bags, aerosol cans, Styrofoam peanuts, Styrofoam containers, Styrofoam blocks, and plastic bags.

Accepts in separate containers:

- Corrugated cardboard
- Glass bottles and jars—all colors
- Will buy back separated aluminum cans

Rinse out all cans and bottles!

No plastic bags!

No Plastic lids and caps!
