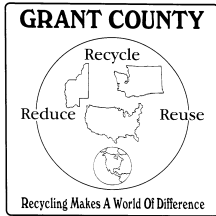

#### Accepts:

- Grass clippings, plants, leaves, tree trimmings, flowers, weeds except for puncture vine (goat heads)

*Maximum size of material is 7 feet in length and 14 inches in diameter. Compost may be purchased. You may pay at the compost facility if you have the correct amount or a check. No change is given.*

### Quincy Recycling Drop-off

#### Accepts:

- Aluminum cans
- Newspaper only (*no magazines, phone books, newspaper inserts, paper bags, etc.*)
- **Flattened corrugated cardboard only** (*no paperboard such as cereal boxes, pop boxes, etc.*)
- Glass bottles and jars (*All colors*)

### Quincy Curbside Recycling Program

#### Accepts:

#### Commingled Recyclables:

- **Plastic Bottles & Containers:** Plastics #1 PET & #2 HDPE (*Bottles with opening smaller than base only*) No lids!
- **Aluminum & Tin Containers** (*Rinsed, metal containers*)
- **Mixed Paper:** Newspaper and inserts, copier & printer paper, magazines, catalogs & phone books
- **Flattened Cardboard and/or Paperboard:** Corrugated cardboard, shoe boxes, cereal, and cracker boxes (*No frozen food boxes*)

**Does not accept:** Plastic bags and film, glass, glass bottles & containers, frozen food boxes, shredded paper, paper food & beverage cartons, scrap metal, batteries, tub containers, lids and caps, plastic clam shell containers, foil, chip bags, aerosol cans, and foam cups & containers

### Ephrata Landfill Recycling

**Residential use only for free items at landfill recycling center**

#### Accepts:

- **Flattened corrugated cardboard** only (*no paperboard such as cereal boxes, pop boxes, etc.*)
- Aluminum cans
- Automobile batteries
- Glass bottles and jars (*All colors*)
- Used motor oil—uncontaminated, 5 gallons max.
- Used antifreeze—uncontaminated, 5 gallons max.
- Household rechargeable batteries
  - Nickel Metal Hydride (NI-MH)*
  - Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd)*
  - Lithium Ion (Li-ion)*
  - Small Sealed Lead (Pb)* (2.2 lbs. or less)
- Scrap metal (*fee*)
- Passenger tires (*fee*)
- Appliances (*fee*)

## Reduce Your Waste!

Recycling is great, but reducing waste in the first place is even better. Waste reduction saves disposal costs, protects our resources and saves landfill space at the landfill near Ephrata. Most of all, you can decrease how much you dispose of even with limited recycling opportunities in Grant County. The following are ideas on how to reduce your waste and make a difference:

- Choose items with the least amount of packaging or buy items in bulk quantities if you are certain you will use all of the product.
- Remove your name from junk mail lists. Mail or fax the address label back to the company that sent the mail and ask to be removed from the mailing list. Don't fall for "free drawing" forms at stores or restaurants. They usually just want your address to send junk mail.
- Use reusable water bottles instead of purchasing single use water bottles.
- Leave your grass clipping on your lawn instead of bagging them.
- Donate unwanted items to Goodwill or a local thrift shop. Have a yard sale or give to a friend or relative.
- Cut back on the number of subscriptions to newspapers and magazines. Instead, share subscriptions among family or friends.

### Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events

Grant County sponsors Household Hazardous Waste Collection events during the spring and fall in Moses Lake. These events are free for Grant County households. For more information, please call Grant County Solid Waste at 509-754-6082.

#### Kitchen:

- Aerosol cans & rodent poison
- Aluminum cleaner w/acid
- Ammonia-based cleaner
- Drain opener w/lye
- Floor products w/solvent
- Furniture polish & metal polish
- Oven cleaner w/lye

#### Bathroom:

- Chlorine bleach
- Deodorizer & air freshener
- Medicine
- Nail polish remover
- Toilet, tub, & tile cleaner

#### Gardening:

- Fertilizer
- Fungicide & moss killer
- Insecticide & pesticide
- Slug & snail bait
- Weed killer & herbicide

#### Garage:

- Antifreeze
- Brake fluid
- Chrome/car polish
- Diesel fuel & gasoline
- Engine degreaser & carburetor cleaner
- Contaminated motor oil

#### Workshops:

- Chemistry sets
- Fiberglass & epoxy resins
- Glue w/solvent
- Gun cleaner
- Oil based paint
- Paint stripper w/solvent
- Paint thinner/turpentine
- Photographic chemicals
- Varnish

#### Miscellaneous:

- Flea powder
- Kerosene & lamp oil
- Lighter fluid
- Moth balls & flakes
- Pool & spa chemicals
- Rechargeable batteries

*Latex paint, uncontaminated motor oil, automotive batteries, and propane tanks are not accepted at household hazardous waste collection events. Year-round collection is available for some items.
