Online Sales Payment and Pick-up Procedures

Congratulations on your winning bid. Grant County appreciates your participation in our auction. Listed below are the instructions for payment and pick-up.

Payment

Payment must be made within 2 business days of the close of auction. If you choose to pay with a credit card, please follow the instructions below. The credit card limit per transaction is \$4,000.00. For payments larger than this amount, follow the instructions listed under Wire Transfers. No cash, checks, or money orders will be accepted. Payment will be processed through Public Processing, LLC, a third-party payment processing company.

Sales Tax and Buyer's Premium

8% Buyer Premium (\$1 minimum premium per auction) shall be added to the final sale price.

Administration Fee: A \$150 charge will be added to the sale of each property. This fee will cover the Recording Fee, Excise Fee, and Processing fee which is required to be collected for each property sale.

Partial Payments

No partial payments are allowed. All auctions must be paid in full by one method of payment.

Credit Cards

Login to the Public Surplus site. Click on "My Stuff" and then click on "Past Bids". Click on the description of the auction and then click on "Pay Online" link located on the right hand side of the screen. Follow the steps to complete the transaction. A receipt will be emailed to you once the payment has cleared.

Wire Transfers Payments

Email buyersupport@publicsurplus.com for wire transfer instructions or request the instructions via publicsurplus.com live chat. Wire transfer can take up to 2 business days to be received and posted. Deeds will be prepared and recorded by the Treasurer's office after we have received notification that the wire transfer has been received and payment has been transferred to Grant County.

Buyer Information

Grant County Treasurer's office will prepare documents to change ownership of the property based upon the bidder registration information. If the winning bidder wishes the Deed property ownership to be in a different name said bidder must contact the Treasurer's office by email that was provided in registration process.
