V. New Business

Health District Update:

- The large scale administering of H1N1 vaccine in schools earlier this month is now completed.
- Two community based clinics were held (BBCC and ML Senior Center, both were open to the general public).
- At BBCC, about 350 H1N1 vaccinations were administered.
- At ML Senior Center, about 250 H1N1 vaccinations were administered.
- These numbers are more than twice what is normally administered with the seasonal influenza vaccine.
- After Action Review process is being conducted for the H1N1 activities
- Healthcare partners are continuing to monitor for H1N1, we are headed into peak influenza season. Keep up the hand washing!

FWAA announces February Safety Training courses:

Ag/Chem Spill Response Training (previously HAZWOPER)

Far West's HAZWOPER Training has taken on a new name! The Ag/Chem Spill Response Training will be held February 9th and 10th in Pasco, WA. Both the 24-hour Basic and the 8-hour Refresher courses will be offered. The courses cover response and clean-up operations of hazardous substances. The 24-hour Basic training costs \$150 for members and the 8-hour Refresher course costs \$75 for members. Registration forms are available on our website: www.fwaa.org.

Anhydrous Ammonia Safety Training

Far West will again be offering Anhydrous Ammonia Safety training **free of charge to you** (compliments of Agrium U.S., Inc.) on February 24th in Moscow, ID and February 25th in Pasco, WA.
