The Quincy Valley Chapter of the Grant County LEPC held their monthly meeting at the Grant County Fire District #3 facility located on C Street SW in Quincy at 9:30am on July 27, 2011.

I. Introductions

The meeting was called to order by Tony, introductions were made.

II. Approval of Minutes

Minutes were review and the motion was made by Jack to accept the Minutes as written, the motion was seconded by Josh, motion carried.

III. Hazardous Materials Spills

May 27th~Grant County PUD reported a spill caused from a loose belt in the drain valve of a turbine hub. The PUD determined that the spill was approximately 420 gallons of turbine oil (toxicity is similar to a mineral oil). Due to the 300,000 cfs of water flowing through the day the spill did not show an oil sheen for over three miles downstream. During the incident the PUD worked with the Department of Ecology and submitted their final reports and findings to Ecology.

IV. Old Business

Tony has not spoken with Frank at Double Diamond in regards to the training requested. The group would still like to find some training for the public sometime in the future.

A reminder that Transcaer railcar training will be held in June of 2012. Tanscaer also has an Ammonia Training available online.

Grant County Department of Emergency Management will be hosting a Preparedness Fair on October 6th at Big Bend.

V. New Business
